With a system consisting of over 90 autonomous dealers, the lift truck group provides quality materials handling equipment to the wide-ranging North American marketplace. Doosan Infracore America Forklift dealers successfully operate in over 220 service and product sales places throughout Canada and the U.S. The lift truck product line impressively features 63 distinctive products consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion forklifts. Capacities of these numerous truck versions vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are designed in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest emerging forklift and lift truck corporation in the North American market, due to its outstanding level of product performance and their consistently high level of buyer support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Lift Truck clients. The U.S. forklift division based in Cleveland has a professional team experienced in Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

Korea's initial domestic forklift marketplace was an open-import enterprise. In the 1960's, Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. begun to import assembled lift trucks as part of a national machinery expansion venture. Initial sales of this manufacturing equipment focused on large business communities, the armed services and on state-run corporations. This eventually led to a unification with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced trade operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical training became the new focus for improving quality and product development.

Home-based forklift business for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an amazing 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's advanced technological advancements combined with sales success placed them in a position of substantial expansion of their forklift operations.

Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the U.S. in 1981, proposed a cooperative venture project to help them in the very competitive North American materials handling industry. This joint-venture proved highly profitable for Daewoo and their lift truck product sales expanded greatly. In 1984, the company finished development of a new facility to help in producing high end value-added products for export. In 1993, the corporation had a international sales system and started exporting models they had established through inhouse technology, as an sovereign brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing growth opportunities into international marketplaces.
